Week 2 1-1:50 pm - parent and child AND 2-2:50 pm - child only

Global Arts - MiniTravelers is an arts enrichment program for preschoolers modeled after Global Arts Odyssey, a wildly popular education arts program for elementary aged children. In our MiniTravelers program children ages 3-5 zoom around the world exploring cultural arts through music, movement, art, drama and storytelling. All classes encourage children to “exercise” both sides of their brains as well as all of their senses. All travelers receive a passport and a daily travel letter with at-home activities to expand their learning.

- In Australia, travelers will learn about Aboriginal culture and the significance of dot painting.
- Traveling to France will introduce children to the work of Matisse and the history of collages.
- Children will travel back in time to Ancient Egypt to learn about the lives of pharaohs.
- The trip to India will provide a glimpse of the Rakhi festival, which honors the sacred bond between brothers and sisters.
- Their time in Virginia will teach them the oldest dance in America—the Virginia Reel.

Week 4 9:30-10:20 am parent and child OR 10:30-11:20 am child only

\$95/week (plus \$30 material fee payable to the instructor on the first day of camp)

- Children will be safari bound in Kenya, painting animals masks and dancing to the Carnival of Animals.
- Traveling to Germany will introduce the children to the work of Brothers Grimm and the history of fairy tales.
- Travelers will learn about the significance of rain sticks in Chile and make their own.
- Russia will offer the children the opportunity to participate in their own performance of the beloved ballet, The Nutcracker.
- Children will learn the healing powers of sand painting in the Native American culture.

Week 10 9-9:50 am parent and child OR 10-10:50 am child only

\$95/week (plus \$30 material fee payable to the instructor on the first day of camp)

- Adventures in the Amazon Rainforest teaches children how to turn trash into treasures.
- While in Japan, travelers participate in Children’s Day.
- Children host their own Cinco de Mayo party.
- Traveling to England introduces children to the works of Shakespeare.
- Time in Zimbabwe offers travelers the opportunity to make beautiful beaded bracelets.
